



Changes to specialist therapy services for young children with cerebral palsy and complex neurodevelopmental conditions in Surrey

Surrey Heartlands Integrated Care Board (ICB) and Surrey Child and Family Health (HCRG Care Group) have shared an update on specialist therapy services for young children in Surrey.

At present, White Lodge Centre are commissioned to provide specialist physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and speech and language therapy for children aged 0–5 who live in Surrey and have cerebral palsy or complex neurodevelopmental conditions.

From 1 April 2026, Surrey Child and Family Health (HCRG Care Group) will be commissioned to deliver the specialist therapy service across all of Surrey.

The service will continue to meet each child's individual needs. Therapy may include physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and language therapy, or a combination of these. Children will continue to receive the care they need, although the delivery of services will change after the transfer.

Until 31 March 2026, the service will run as it does now, and White Lodge will continue to accept referrals. From 1 April 2026, children who live in Surrey will transfer to Surrey Child and Family Health (HCRG Care Group).

Clinical teams will plan and manage the transition to support safety, continuity of care, and minimal disruption. Surrey Heartlands ICB will oversee this process.

Further details about delivery arrangements will be shared over the coming months.

Families will receive regular updates and will have opportunities to ask questions and understand what the changes mean for their child.
